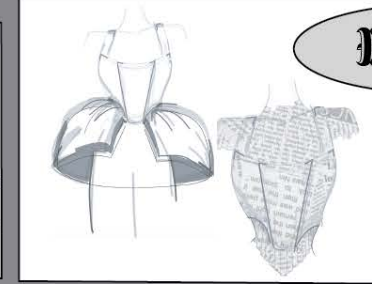

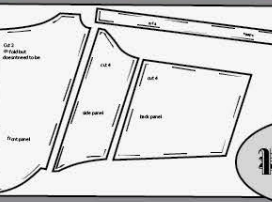

Pattern

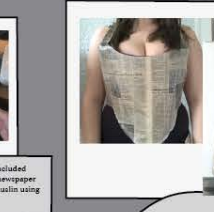
Process



To create the structure in the bodice and the bustier, I used boning for the shoulder piece. I turned the newspaper to a padded dress form when it was wet and essentially made a shell of my shoulder.



I hand cut the lining details after the polyurethane had fully set.



For every piece included in the outfit the newspaper is laminated to muslin using Polyurethane.
